1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

1. Feedback from the students

The students were given a response sheet based on the Performa containing a questionnaire about their teachers, syllabi etc. They were asked to fill in their responses. Total confidentiality was ensured to them. The plan was to communicate the adverse comments, if any, to the concerned teachers discreetly so that they took remedial action.

The HoD's examined the responses but the responses were more or less favourable, thus needing no communication to the teachers.

2. Feedback from the Teachers

Feedback from the teachers about the coverage of the syllabus is obtained through a notice, close to the commencement of examinations, asking them to fill a form, stating the status of the coverage of syllabus. There are columns with headings 'Portions of the syllabus covered', 'Portions that are yet to be covered' and 'Reasons for the non-coverage'. The forms are analysed by the Head of the Institution and necessary instructions issued.

Feedback about syllabus and the students are taken informally during the various staff meetings held from time to time and necessary instructions issued.

2.3.2 Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Yes, student mentoring system is available in the institution. A teacher is assigned to each class as mentor. The mentor keeps tab on each and every student in the class. He is asked to maintain a close contact with the students of his class. He also has to keep a track of his parents, their contact number, so that a communication link is maintained with them for the well-being of the student.

Since the university is partly residential also, so there is a special focus on students residing in the hostel. The mentor also keeps enquiring about the boarding and lodging conditions at the hostel. He also is supposed to report any signs of any social, physical or psychological problems in the students.

After the university hours, the hostel inmates are under the care of the hostel wardens. Since, this is a university with a difference (trying to keep alive some of the traditions of gurukulas of yore, attempt is made to ensure a well-regulated, disciplined

hostel life for the hostel inmates. They are advised to keep regular sleeping and waking hours, study and tv times. Also, they are advised and encouraged to take part in morning prayer ceremonies and evening rituals and chanting. Some kind teachers also encourage them have Geeta Recitation sessions in the morning or evening.

It is also the duty of the mentor to keep a watchful eye for any signs of ragging, drug abuse, or antisocial behaviour among the students under his / her care, and to report to higher authorities if he /she notices anything awry.

Under the Sushant Ruhella Initiative, the mentor-teachers are also tasked to keep an eye on the emotional well-being of the students and report any abnormality such as depression etc. to the concerned cell. The mentors are to be especially careful with the students /hostel inmates who have had a traumatic experience, such as, loss of a parent, or loved one.

Arrangements have also been made for having a psychologist / psychiatrist on call to whom the mentors can call or consult in case of any problem with the students.
